Given recent events in our local community that received media coverage this week, some of our senior students have used this event as a springboard to engage in critical thinking. They have been exploring questions regarding what makes a community and how can we make a positive contribution to our community. Through their discussions and thinking some really good ideas have been put forward so they have decided to write to the Auckland City Councilors with their suggestions. In this way they can help turn a negative local event into a positive action by offering solutions. Next week we'll share some of their ideas.

While at Waterlea we want our students to begin to develop a sense of citizenship and the responsibilities that go with belonging to a community whether the context be their classroom, Waterlea School, Mangere Bridge or New Zealand. Exploring current events is a positive way of supporting our tamariki to make sense of their world by considering different perspectives and the exploring the wider impact of making certain choices.

When children are in the more junior classes at school, developing a sense of citizenship means learning to be a monitor in the classroom, sharing and caring for classroom equipment and what it is to be a good friend. This year as a school, we are focusing on friendship in a more intentional way to help all students navigate and problem solve when it comes to having friendship issues. Our focus on friendship is part of the wider umbrella of promoting student Hauora/Wellbeing. Research tells us that for students to be fully engaged in learning their social wellbeing needs to be intact. The Bounce Back Programme introduced in some classes last year is a great way for teachers to unpack strategies for children to help them understand the different and changing dynamics of friendships. The better understanding our children have— the greater chance they have some things to try when they experience problems and to build resilience.
