Health/Sickness Update

Please be aware a nasty illness with flu-like symptoms has starting to make it's way through some of our classes. Signs and symptoms of this illness include fevers, headaches, loss of appetite and in some cases, vomiting.

We currently have a couple of children/families at school with immune system issues which means that there can be serious consequences if they catch the same common childhood illnesses as everyone else. Therefore we kindly ask that you follow the following Ministry of Health guidelines regarding illness and when to keep your child at home. This will help to stop the spread of illness and keep our community healthy.

Fever: any temperature of 38 degrees or more is a fever - this means they are fighting an illness/infection. Keep children at home if they have a fever.

Gastro illness or tummy bug: the Ministry of Health advises that children remain at home for 48 hours after
