Tickets can be purchased through the school office by returning a completed ticket form with payment. A ticket form is attached at the end of this newsletter and more are available through the school office. All senior school students are to arrive at school at 5:30pm for the evening performances and are to be collected from their classroom by 8pm following the show.

There will be snacks available to purchase at the evening performances, don't forget your cash!

Please note, all students will have the opportunity to watch the dress rehearsal of the show on Tuesday 27 August during the school day.

We also have **Student Led Conferences** coming up in a couple of weeks - Thursday, 12 September. This is only for children in Years 3-6 and the Year 1-2 children will have their turn early next term. #### Starting Times and Lateness

A reminder that children are expected to be at school before the first handbell rings at 8.50am. If your child happens to arrive after the final bell at 9.00am, they must go to the office to register their name and take a late card to give their teacher.


#### Sarah Nicolls-Kaitiaki in Action!
