Health Notices

- Head lice: We still have persistent and reoccurring cases of head lice at Waterlea. It is important that everyone makes the effort to check and treat their child's hair as they spread so easily. Head lice treatment need not be expensive—Dimethicone lotion is a very effective treatment that your family doctor can prescribe. Alternatively, wet combing with cheap conditioner and a head lice comb is also an effective way to find and remove head lice if done thoroughly. Instructions on how to do this can be found further in this newsletter. Thank you for your help with this.
- Chickenpox: We currently have a number of cases of Chickenpox in Years 0-1. Chickenpox is a common childhood illness caused by a virus—it is very easy to catch but most cases are usually mild. It first appears as cold symptoms but then a red rash of small blisters will appear on the body, usually starting on the face, chest and back. Children should stay away from school while they are infectious—once scabs form on all the spots, your child is no longer infectious. They may go back to school when the spots are all scabbed over and dry. This can take around 5-7 days. Please refer to your doctor if your child is presenting the above signs and has not yet had chicken pox.

Head lice - checking and treating with wet comb & conditioner

Wet combing with conditioner and a fine tooth nit comb (without using chemicals) is an effective way to find and remove head lice, if done properly.

It can take up to an hour to remove all live lice and eggs. It depends how thick and long the hair is.



- Make your child comfortable and let them read their favourite book or watch their favourite programme or movie.
- Comb or brush out knots with an ordinary comb. Put lots of conditioner through wet or dry hair.
- Start at the scalp and go all the way down to the hair ends.



Comb conditioner through hair, using an ordinary comb.



 Change to a fine-tooth head lice comb and comb sections of your child's hair.



Comb from the roots to the ends of the hair.



- After each comb, wipe the conditioner on to a paper towel or tissue.
- Check the tissue or paper towel for lice and eggs. They're small so look closely!



- Comb every part of the head, section by section. Comb each section at least 4 or 5 times before moving on to the next section.
- Rinse out conditioner.
- If you find lice or eggs, repeat these steps every day if you can manage it, but at least every 2 to 3 days - until no lice for 3 days in a row.
- Check the hair of everyone in the house twice a week for the next 2 weeks to make sure everyone stays clear.
