Last week we mentioned the fact that there are some quite extensive roadworks planned for House Avenue and Muir Avenue. The good people at Traffica who will oversee this project visited us yesterday to let us know the roadworks could start as early as next week. They will let us know five days before the work begins and when this happens we will email all families so you can plan accordingly. If you drive your children and drop them off outside school it might pay to start thinking about what you might do differently in the mornings. Our understanding is that House Ave will be a one way system and the current parking outside the school will not be available.

Here are some possible alternative parking ideas:

- Drop children off in Sullivan Avenue for them to walk through Waterlea Park to school.
- Drop children off on Seaforth Avenue and children walk up Nadine Place to the back gate of the school
- Drop children off on Ambury Road and children cross at the crossings to school.

These roadworks also give families an opportunity to walk to school. Waterlea has several Walking School Buses and if you're interested in children joining these walking groups you can go to waterlea.school.nz/information/walking-school-bus for routes and contact details.

We have a new group of children and their families doing transition to school visits at the moment and our next Year 1 classroom opens on 9 March—they will be starting in Room 1 with Helen Wedde. Our next Year 1 class will open the first day of Term 2 on 28 April. This class will start in Room 21 and the teachers will be Rachel Davis and Janelle Smith.

School Donation

Just a reminder to families that last year the board decided to opt into the government's donation scheme. This means Waterlea School will no longer be asking whanau for an annual family donation. We will be receiving additional funding from the government for school trips if the trip is directly linked to enhancing learning programmes. There are some things that aren't covered under this scheme and this includes the events planned for the Year 5 & 6 EOTC week in March. For these events we will be asking for a donation towards expenses and the school and PTA will subsidise the rest. More information regarding this will come home soon and thanks to all the parents who have signed up to help us for that week's events.
