Kia orana and welcome to Cook Island Language week- Epetoma o te reo Māori Kūki 'Āirani. The theme for Cook Islands language week is "Kia pūāvai tō tātou Reo Māori Kūki 'Āirani i Aotearoa" which in English means "That the Cook Islands Māori language may blossom throughout New Zealand." As we have quite a number of students at Waterlea with Cook Island heritage we thought we'd add some of the language basics to help you get you started at home:

Kia orāna = Hello Kia orāna korua = Hello to two

Kia orāna kotou = Hello to three or more

Pē'ea koe = How are you? Pē'ea korua = How are you two?

Meitaki au = I am fine Meitaki maua = We (two) are fine

Meitaki ma'ata = Thank you Aere rā = Goodbye

Te tangianga o te reo – Pronunciation tips

Te reo Māori Kūki 'Āirani (Cook Islands Māori language) has a number of distinct dialects and languages: Aitutaki; Ātiu, Ma'uke, and Miti'āro (Ngā Pūtoru); Mangaia; Manihiki; Rakahanga; Rarotonga; Tongareva; and Pukapuka. There are five vouvera (vowels): a, e, i, o, u These have the same pronunciation as other Pacific languages, including te reo Māori (NZ Māori language). Vouvera can be short or long (the long vowel sound is indicated with a macron). a, e, i, o, u (as in the English: are, there, three or two) ā, ē, ī, ō, ū ( as in the English: father, egg, feet, thought, loot) It is important that the short and long vowel sounds are used, as they distinguish between different words – eg. marama (moon) and mārama (daylight). Te reo Māori Kūki 'Āirani has nine main consonants: ng, k, m, n, p, r, t, v and ' (glottal stop)

We also learnt all about the early Polynesian wayfinders who first came to NZ. It is believed that a lot of people started in Taiwan in the ice age and moved across the Pacific.
