One of their ideas was the Māori language moment which happened at midday on Monday. At this time many of our Waterlea tamariki and kaiako along with many others throughout the country participated in this moment dedicated to te reo Māori. In fact Kiwis across Aotearoa and the world made history with over a million people coming together to celebrate te reo Māori



at the same time. According to the Māori Language Commissioner Professor Rawinia Higgins- "This is the largest, single celebration of te reo Māori in history. We have never had this many people celebrating our language together at the same time." Some of the ways Waterlea School participated in this history making moment were singing waiata, karakia, counting, using sign language and reading stories in te reo Māori.
