Did you know there are over 60 000 New Zealanders who identify as Tongan. Currently, there are more Tongan people born in New Zealand than there are in Tonga, giving lea faka-Tonga (the Tonga language) and anga faka-Tonga (Tonga culture) a special place here. Tongan Language

Week / Uike Kātoanga'i 'o e lea faka-Tonga gives students of all cultures the chance to learn some basic lea faka-Tonga, and gives students who speak lea faka-Tonga the chance to be experts in the classroom. Tongan speaking students at Waterlea are our experts this week helping us all when we try some basic tongan key words and greetings e.g. Mālō e lelei- hello Fefe hake-how are you? Sai pe malo-good thanks Tulou-excuse me Kataki-please
