What a surprise I got today on crossing duty when I spotted a wizard walking to school! The Waterlea Waka Wae Wae is nearly two years old! We now have 25 children who walk to school or home from school several days a week. Our bus walks from Mojo's Superette, along Wallace to Muir Ave, and down Muir Ave to school. This morning the Waka Wae Wae was lucky enough to have a visit from the Auckland Transport Winter Wizard.....a prize the bus won just before the last lockdown. The wizard walked with the children to school and then he joined everyone for a glass of juice and a biscuit as a treat when they got to school. The bus is run by parent volunteers (in connection with Auckland Transport). Walking to or from school on the bus is a great way to spend time with friends, get some fresh air and exercise, and take care of the environment. The children also have 'bus tickets' which get clicked every time they walk. After every 25 clicks children earn a certificate, or special bag tag, or other spot prizes. If you are not on the current route but would like to start up a bus of your own, contact Rachel and she can tell you how easy it is (even just one or two mornings a week).







Welcome to Tokelau Language Week 2020- Vaiaho o te Gagana Tokelau 2020. The 2020 Tokelau Language Week theme is 'Apoapo tau foe, i nā tāfea i te galutau. Ke mau mai, ke mau mai' which in English means, 'Never give up hope, even amidst chaos and much uncertainty. Stay united, stay strong'.

Vaiaho o te Gagana Tokelau (Tokelau Language Week) celebrates the culture and language of Faka-Tokelau (The Tokelauan way of life). This week gives us an opportunity to celebrate the wonderful and unique culture, language and people of Tokelau.

#### Did you know?

- The name Tokelau means the "North Wind".
- Tokelau consists of three small coral atolls: Atafu, the most northern atoll has a surface area of 3.5km square; Nukunonu, the central atoll, is 4.7km square; and Fakaofo, the southern atoll, is 4km square. From Atafu in the north to Fakaofo in the south, Tokelau extends for less than 200km and the atolls are just 3-5 metres

Of the 295,941 total Pacific population in the New Zealand Census 2013, 7,173 Pacific people identified themselves as Tokelauan.

- There are approximately 1,400 people living in Tokelau.


