Talofa lava and welcome to Samoan Language Week. This year's theme for Vaiaso o le Gagana Samoa - Samoa Language Week 2021 is Poupou le lotoifale. Ola manuia le anofale which means strengthen the posts of your house, for all to thrive.

When you're building a foundation for a fale (house) it can't have a weak foundation or posts. This is the same for the foundations of our families, schools and churches that play an important role in strengthening Gagana Samoa (the Samoan Language). Language is important for the foundations of our overall wellbeing.

Vaiaso o le Gagana Samoa - Samoa Language Week 2021 is also a chance for our students to dress in the Samoan traditional way if they wish while at school and share their knowledge about their language and culture.

A couple of Fridays ago we had a MANA values assembly and awarded our Korowai to Greta Thompson of Room 23. She consistently demonstrates all of our four Waterlea values! Well done Greta!



Waterlea is part of a Kahui Ako or a community with 10 other schools. We

collaborate with these other schools in all kinds of ways regarding learning. One of our collaborations focusses on Kaitiakitanga or sustainability/guardianship of our environment and we have a student group that goes out regularly to do beach cleanups. This term we are extending this theme of guardianship of our environment and have a group of Waterlea students joining students from other schools who will be involved in some tree planting on Te Pane o Mataoho/ Māngere Mountain. The students representing Waterlea are those who are already quite involved in the Waterlea Gardening Club, facilitated by Megan Lundberg. We look forward to hearing how they get on.

If you have not yet sent back your permission slips please do so ASAP!

Winter Health Update

As we head into the Winter illness season we ask that you are mindful of the children/families at school with immune system issues which means that there can be serious consequences if they catch the same common childhood illnesses as everyone else. Therefore we kindly ask that you follow the Ministry of Health guidelines regarding illness and when to keep your child at home. This will help to stop the spread of illness and keep our community healthy.

- Fever: any temperature of 38 degrees or more is a fever - this means they are fighting an illness/ infection. Keep children at home if they have a fever, please don't just give them pamol and send them in!

- Gastro illness or tummy bug: the Ministry of Health advises that children do not return to school until well and for 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting.

- Chicken Pox: infected children can return to school when the spots are all scabbed over and dry. This can take around 5-7 days. Please advise the school if your child has been diagnosed with chicken pox.

Dental Services Update

We have been advised by the Auckland Regional Dental Service that there is a very large backlog of children to be seen due to the Covid lockdowns. As they are no longer directly engaging with families we ask that you give them a call and book an appointment so that your children do not miss out on this vital service.


