We have now had two weeks of our new rostered school system. As you will be aware, we are using Fridays for some of our tamariki who need additional support to return to school and for our transition processes to continue. We are also organising a very different version of the Year 6 graduation

celebrations for December 10th and more details will come out regarding this in the coming days. Last Friday we held a lovely face to face, socially distanced picnic at Waterlea Park for a group of students and their whanau who have only met online through zoom. The sun was shining and it was a lovely way to welcome new families and students to Waterlea. We are hoping to have another such picnic on the last Friday of the term.



You may have heard that everyone in Aotearoa will

move to the new COVID-19 Traffic Light Framework on Friday 3 December. In Auckland, we will be moving to Red, allowing for a careful reopening while continuing to protect New Zealanders. For Waterlea and other Auckland schools, this means that we don't change the way we are operating classes. Everyone continues to attend school onsite in the rostered manner (odd/even days) we introduced the week before last. This plan will continue until the end of the year.

For next year, we can confirm that everyone will be back onsite for learning from the start of the school year, regardless of what setting under the new Traffic Light Framework we will be in (Red/Orange/Green). This is good news and means we can plan for a great 2022.

Health measures in place at school

This year and next, health, safety and wellbeing will continue to be a priority for us and the same public health measures you are very familiar with will remain in place:

- good hygiene and cleaning
- contact tracing systems in place
- vaccination requirements for staff and volunteers
- if you are sick you must stay home and get tested
- good ventilation

While we are at Red this year or at any stage next year:

- face coverings will be required at school when indoors for students in years 4 –6 and all staff
- we will ensure that only essential visitors come onsite

With all these measures in place, public health has confirmed the risk of infection remains low when at school. However, if we do have someone confirmed with COVID-19 in our school, we have a plan in place to manage this and will keep the community informed.
