The visits to the pool and the bus transport are all fully funded by John Walker Find Your Field of Dreams Foundation.

Waterlea is part of a Kahui Ako (or learning community) with 10 other schools and a number of local ECE. We collaborate with these other kura to create additional opportunities for tamariki and kaiako to learn from each other. As a learning community, our mahi also involves creating strong transition pathways from one learning context to another. One such collaboration, the Kahui Ako Enviro Group, has a focus on Kaitiakitanga or sustainability/guardianship of our environment. This collaboration sits well as we consider issues around Aotearoa's future and climate change which is a hot topic at the moment.

Waterlea's Enviro Group is led by Camilla Jackson and she has a group of committed students that go out regularly to do beach cleanups in the local area. This term we have a couple of community events coming up that our Kahui Ako schools will be involved with and we are inviting families to join in. The first is a tree planting event on Te Pane o Mataoho/ Māngere Mountain. This event is called Mahi on the Maunga and will be held on Saturday 11 June between 10-1pm.
