A warm welcome back to school for tamariki and staff for Term 2- we hope you all had a good Easter break and were able to spend time with whānau and friends. You will remember that at the end of last term, Auckland shifted from the Red setting of the traffic light system to Orange. At the time we communicated to you that we would keep the existing health measures in place and review them upon our return this term to see what changes we would make.

Currently, all staff are taking a Health & Safety survey regarding these health measures at their place of work and when this process is completed we will make some decisions as a school. One of the issues under consideration is continued mask wearing for Year 4-6 students. Although no longer mandated under Orange, mask wearing is highly recommended. At Waterlea, we highly recommend wearing masks indoors because it has been so effective in slowing the spread of the virus and kept learning happening for our tamariki with very few disruptions last term. Student absenteeism due to COVID-19 is hard on all families but particularly challenging for ones already impacted by issues of inequality and hardship. We acknowledge that some families with children in Year 4-6 might choose to send their children to school without masks. If this is your preference please let us know so we can put some measures in place to support your decision in this. Other health measures such as good hand hygiene, restricting parents onsite unless on official business and good ventilation in classrooms are still in place for the time being. We will continue to communicate any additional changes we make and thanks in advance for your patience.

Over the coming term we are very pleased to announce we are planning to bring back some of our regular student activities. These include training sessions in peer mediation and patrols for our senior students. We are also planning to have onsite Student Led Conferences later this term, swimming starts for Years 3-6 in Week 3 and there are some trips planned. All activities need to be carefully considered and planned appropriately so we will take our time to ensure these processes are done well.

Fun fact! The last three copies were sent to a whānau in Dubai!


