Across the country, communities are getting excited about the first ever celebration of Matariki as a public holiday this week.

Matariki holds many meanings throughout Aotearoa and across the world and learning about it gives us an opportunity to explore and strengthen our local identities. We aim to protect the deep history of Matariki, including local variations and narratives.

Celebrating Matariki together as a nation provides an opportunity for Māori language, culture and history to be more accessible to all New Zealanders both here and overseas. It supports us to reflect the value we place in our cultural heritage and helps develop a better sense of our national identity.

Matariki is the Māori name for the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades. Many cultures have their own historical references to this cluster of stars. In Aotearoa, Matariki marks the beginning of the Māori new year and has traditionally been celebrated exploring several important themes that

link the past, present and future.

- reflection: remembering loved ones who have passed on, especially within the past lunar year
- celebration: celebrating the bounty and blessings of the present
- aspiration: setting aspirations to ensure that that bounty can continue long into the future with a focus on environmental protection and regeneration

We celebrate Matariki at Waterlea in a number of ways including a public holiday on Friday, an online assembly and different arts and crafts taking place in classrooms. Next week we'll feature some of the learning that has taken place for Matariki.

A huge thanks to our whanau for such a great turn out for our Teacher Led Conferences. It was heartening to see so many of you onsite and taking advantage of talking kanohi ke te kanohi or face to face with your child's teacher. We'd love to get your feedback on this because we are thinking of replacing one of our SLC permanently so parents have this opportunity every year. We are looking forward to the upcoming year and hope to overcome the challenges that social distancing is providing with our usual fundraising activities to assist Waterlea School.


