Yesterday we welcomed our newest cohort of New Entrant children who have started school after their three school visits. We hope you have very happy school days at Waterlea! We have another group visiting in a couple of weeks and they will start after the school holidays in Room 21 with Janelle Smith.



As you will know, last week we celebrated Samoan Language Week at Waterlea School. All of our tamariki had opportunities to engage in the language, food and culture of Samoa. Even Pepe entered into the celebrations on her school visit and Anna from Room 1 joined in the celebrations too (above). We have captured some of the other learning activities that took place...



Room 12 (left) learnt and performed the Sasa. Sasa is a Samoan word for a particular group dance. The Sasa can be performed by both males and females in a seated position or sometimes standing.



Room 1 made these lovely siapo tapa designs (left) using different coloured paper for effect. In traditional and modern times Tapa was ceremonially displayed on special occasions, such as birthdays and weddings.

Room 8 created more traditional Siapo / Tapa designs (right)

Siapo, also known as tapa, is one of the oldest Samoan traditional art forms. Siapo or tapa cloth is not just art, it can be used for clothing, burial shrouds, bed covers, ceremonial garments and much more.

Room 8 explored traditional Samoan shapes and designs and we used some of these in our art. We practised drawing some of these on scrap paper before we did the real art. We used recycled brown shopping bags, and we used scissors to cut the bags into pieces.

Next, we drew the designs in pencil onto the brown paper and then used black vivid to make the design more effective.



Then after that, we scrunched the brown paper up several times to make it soft and to give it texture. Next, we used dye to make our siapo art look colourful. Lastly, we let them dry and they looked majestic after they dried.


