
30 September—Term 3 Finishes

It was an early start for some of us last Thursday as we welcomed the new classrooms onto the Waterlea site in the early hours of the morning. It was well worth the effort, as it was fascinating to watch the process of transporting the building up House Avenue, then onto the turf and finally settling it in behind Room 12. The building came in two parts so our tamariki were able to watch the larger part move across the field and then join with the smaller part - it was quite exciting! It provided the inspiration for lots of photos, videos, drawings and stories last week and some of these are featured later.

The buildings are propped up quite high from the ground and will be lowered later in the week after the power and water are connected. From there a deck and canopy will be erected and the classrooms should be ready for use in Term 4. This will be a timely finish date as we are hoping to commence the refurbishment of the senior school block in the first term of next year and these new classrooms will be used to accommodate the older students whilst this refurbishment is underway. Much work has gone on behind the scenes between the Ministry of Education and Waterlea's Board of Trustees to make these building projects happen. As a school we are very



grateful for those who have worked hard planning these property improvements which will add so much value to our teaching spaces.




<u>Important Community Regarding Harbour Connections</u>

Our school isn't the only place in Mangere Bridge with building improvements. You will have noticed that Ngā Hau Mangere, the new walking and cycling connection across the Manukau Harbour is near completion and will open on 27 August. Please have a read of the following

information regarding the opening of the bridge and the closure of the underpass under the motorway bridge.

Join us to celebrate the opening of Ngā Hau Māngere





Since the Old Mangere Bridge closed in late 2018 and while the new bridge has been under construction, people have been able to cross the Manukau Harbour on foot or wheels using the SH2O underpass.

With the new bridge opening we have decided to close the underpass in late 2022. There is no funding to continue to provide a high level of service required on the route to keep it open. People travelling through the area will use the new bridge which caters for people walking and cycling.

Important notice

From 1 September, there will be no monitored CCTV or security guards on site along the SH20 underpass. To cross the Manukau Harbour, we recommend using the new bridge.

Royal Oak Intermediate School Board of Trustees' election
