As we count down to the end of the term, it might be helpful to give a summary of the end of year school events so you can be sure to get them in the calendar. If you have children in Year 6 there are quite a few to be mindful of and there are others that will be applicable for all year levels.

- Friday 2 December PTA Disco: This event is open to all Waterlea tamariki and their whanau and is held in the David Lange Hall from 5-7pm
- 2. Tuesday 6 December Year 6 Graduation: This event is attended by the Year 5 and 6s and whānau of graduating Year 6 students. It will run from 10am-12pm and, in the past, some parents have taken the opportunity to take their graduating child out afterwards for a special lunch or similar. If you wish to do this please just ensure you fill in an early leaving form at the office before you go.
- 3. Wednesday 7 December Whānau Waiata Wednesday:
 This will be a special Waiata Wednesday which all Year 1
 whānau are invited to attend from 2pm outside the Room
 1-4 block.
- 4. **Wednesday 7 December Year 6 Dine and Dance:** This is the special Year 6 leaver's dinner and held in the David Lange Hall between 5.30-7.30pm. More information to come to Year 6 parents.
- 5. Thursday 8 December Final Assembly: The whole school will come together to reflect on 2022, farewell leaving staff and enjoy some items from classes. This runs from 2pm-3pm and all whānau are very welcome to attend.
- 6. **Friday 9 December Year 6 Pool Party:** All day at Jellicoe Pools more information to come to Year 6 parents.

- 7. **Monday 12 December Meet Your Teacher for 2023:** Children will be advised of their classes for 2023 and will spend some of the morning with their new teacher and classmates. This is for children only parents are not involved and an email will be sent advising you of your child's 2023 class placement. Wānanga will be able to be booked with the teacher after this date
- 8. **Tuesday 13 December Final Day of School:** School closes at 1pm.

The Start of the 2023 School Year

We will be starting the new school year with our Waterlea Wānanga. This is when we make time for your child's teacher to meet with you and your child in a 15 minute hui. In this meeting we want to hear from you about your child so that we understand a bit more about them before the year starts. Wānanga will be held on Wednesday 1 February starting at 8.30am until 4.30pm. SKIDs will be open that day for childcare. Contact 0800 900 754 for more information from them.

Information on how to book your wānanga will come out over the next few weeks. This can be booked once you know your child's class/teacher for next year - after they have met their teacher on 12 December.

Thursday 2 February, all children will be at school for their first full day, starting at our usual time of 8.50am This will be followed by our Waterlea Powhiri at 9.15am. This is an opportunity for all whānau, tamariki and staff new to Waterlea to be formally welcomed.

Health/Sickness Update

In addition to Covid-19, which is still present in the community, we have noted there are still colds/flus and gastro bugs going around. We kindly ask that you follow the Ministry of Health guidelines regarding illness and when to keep your child at home. Please keep your child home if they are unwell - even if they produce a negative Covid test. This will help to stop the spread of illness and keep our community healthy.

- Fever: any temperature of 38 degrees or more is a fever this means they are fighting an illness/ infection. Keep children at home if they have a fever even if you have administered Paracetamol to bring the temperature down, your child is still unwell and likely contagious.
- Gastro illness or tummy bug: the Ministry of Health advises that children remain at home for 48 hours after their last vomit/diarrhea



TICKETS

Early-bird tickets and DISCO DOLLAR sales will be outside the school hall on 29 November, 30 November and 1 December between 2.45pm and 3.15pm. The early-bird cost is \$3 per child. \$4 door sales will also be available on the night.

DISCO DOLLARS

\$1 is equivalent to 1 DISCO DOLLAR.

Official "DISCO DOLLARS" can only be used for purchasing items and activities inside. We advise that you pre-purchase "DISCO DOLLARS" prior to coming to the disco to avoid lengthy queues.

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Eftpos will be available on the night to purchase "DISCO DOLLARS" if required, however, we will only have one terminal operating.

PRE-SCHOOL CHILDREN

Pre-school children are able to attend the disco for free. Note the event will have loud music, be darkened to allow neon lights to glow and there may be strobe lighting used at times.
