This Friday, 10 March we are planning to walk to Ambury farm for our Feet First Whaanau Day. This is a great opportunity for us to explore our local environment as a community as part of our local curriculum. Simon Hafoka, who is our advisor with our Healthy Active learning initiative, will join us at the farm to organise some games and will talk about the partnership with the Waterlea promoting Healthy Active Learning. If you're interested in coming along, we will assemble on the court at 9:15am and aim to set off by 9:30am. The Year 1-3 tamariki will walk via Muir Ave and the Year 4-6 tamariki will walk along the foreshore pathway.

We will have morning tea there, play some games and then head back, aiming to arrive back at school around 11.00am.

All children **must wear shoes** and a hat and bring a water bottle. Please apply sunscreen to your tamariki before they come to school - we will also have some sunscreen available on the day.

We would LOVE to have parents or any whaanau members come along with us if you are available. Younger siblings are welcome to accompany their parents.

If the weather isn't looking good, we will make a call on Thursday evening and let you know via seesaw and email if we need to postpone.

Lockdown Drill

Today, before morning tea, we practised a lockdown drill. Having planned drills for lockdown and fires are part of our school Emergency Procedures. Before the drill, we talked to all classes

about what to expect so there were no surprises. To make the drill as child friendly as possible, the rationale we used was that we needed to know what to do if there was an unknown dog on the playground, in order to keep everyone safe. During the drill a message was given over the intercom system that we were going into lockdown, children went into their classrooms and sat on the mat, the roll was called by their teacher and they waited there until the all clear signal was given over the intercom system. The whole school practised the drill for about 5 minutes and then they all went out for morning tea. We will do this again before the end of the term and we will also practise what we do for a fire drill.

Potential Strike Action Next Week

As many of you will have heard in the media, there is a possibility the primary teachers and principals might go on strike on Thursday March 16. This is due to minimal progress in collective agreement negotiations with the government. Most of the teachers at Waterlea are members of NZEI (the teacher's union) and if the strike goes ahead and they decide to join, the Board of Trustees may need to close the school for one day.

Last week, Paid Union Meetings (PUMS) were held and many schools closed for half a day so teachers could attend. At these meetings teachers across the country rejected the pay, staffing and resourcing offer put up by the Ministry of Education. Waterlea decided not to close the school due the disruptions we have already experienced this year. Following these meetings the teachers participated in a ballot regarding strike action and the results will be known in the next couple of days.

As soon as there is any confirmation of the strike we will inform our whaanau via text and email with the board's intention.
