As you will know Waterlea has a school waiata, Ākitai. Ākitai tells the story of our local area from the perspective of mana whenua. Last week Waterlea welcomed Mountain View School to our kura for a very special event-the gifting of our waiata to their kura. We would like to thank Matua Kimoro Taiepa for composing Ākitai and allowing us to share it with Mountain View School who share our local stories too. Mountain View's principal Ben Hutchings, their Kapa Haka and Kathleen Wilson came to accept the waiata. Waterlea sang Ākitai to them and in response their Kapa Haka performed for us. Mountain View School then presented Waterlea with a pounamu as a thank you and this will be displayed in the David Lange Memorial Hall's foyer. The words and translation to Ākitai are included below because it is the story for all who live in this place. We have also included photos of this special event.

Ākitai

Ko Kiwi Tāmaki te tangata

Kiwi Tāmaki is the paramount chief of Te Ākitai Waiohua

He uri nō Huakaiwaka

Kiwi Tāmaki is a direct descendant of Huakaiwaka

Ko Tainui te waka

Tainui is the waka

Ko Te Mānuka o Hoturoa te moana e

Te Manuka o Hoturoa is the moana (translates to the troublesome sandbanks of Hoturoa, because of the shifting tides and shallow sandbanks)

Ko Te Pane o Mataoho te maunga

Te Pane o Mataoho is the maunga. This translates to 'the





forehead of Mataoho' - Mataoho is the Maori guardian/ god of volcanoes. The full name for Ihumātao is Te Ihu o Mataoho - the nose of Mataoho.

Ka titiro ki te Motu o Hiaroa

Look to te Motu o Hiaroa (Puketutu Island)

Ko Kaiwhare me Taramainuku ngā taniwha tūpuna

Kaiwhare and Taramainuku are the taniwha ancestors

No roto Tamaki e

Here in Tāmaki

Akitai tāngata, kei Tāmaki te rua o Te Waiōhua e!

O Te Waiohua e!

HAKA: Tāmaki Makaurau! Tāmaki Herehere i ngā waka o te motu

Hi! Hā! Hī! Aue hī!
