
Kia ora

Welcome to Uike Lea Faka-Tonga 2023 or Tongan Language Week. The theme for this year is 'E tu'uloa 'a e Lea faka-Tongá 'o ka lea'aki 'i 'api, siasí (lotú), mo e nofo-'a-kāingá, which means the Tongan Language will be sustainable if used at home, church and in the wider community.

The word TU'ULOA in the theme adds a positive and progressive feeling and means to continuously grow, nurture, and sustain a valued idea, practice, event, or memory in an enduring way. This year's theme focused on the importance of using lea faka-Tonga or the Tongan language emphasises the importance not only to understand lea Faka-Tonga, but to also use it as much as possible at home, church and school. When our fānaú are proud of their language and can speak it, they will also be more grounded in their identity as a Tongan. Today at our Middle School assembly our fānaú were proudly using their lea faka-Tonga and sharing aspects of their Tongan language, culture and identity. We acknowledge and thank their kāinga for supporting them this morning.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

TICKETS

Early-bird tickets and TOKENS sales will be outside the school hall on 5 September, 6 September and 7 September between 2.45pm and 3.15pm. The early-bird cost is \$3 per child. \$4 door sales will also be available on the night.

DISCO TOKENS

\$1 is equivalent to 1 TOKEN.

Official TOKENS can only be used for purchasing items and activities inside. We advise that you pre-purchase your TOKENS prior to coming to the disco to avoid lengthy queues.

Eftpos will be available on the night to purchase TOKENS if required.

PRE-SCHOOL CHILDREN

Pre-school children are able to attend the disco for free. Note the event will have loud music, be darkened to allow neon lights to glow and there may be strobe lighting used at times.

HOW TO AVOID QUEUES ON THE NIGHT

If you have purchased an early bird ticket, please ensure your child is wearing their wristband. This will allow them and yourself to walk through the pre-sales line quickly and start dancing sooner. We also advise to purchase TOKENS prior to avoid any queues too!


