Many of our tamariki and whaanau recently celebrated Diwali with their friends and families. Diwali is considered to be one of the most important festivals of lights, a celebration of light over darkness. Some of our tamariki learnt that during Diwali, families decorate the front of their house with Rangoli patterns. In Room 3 and Room 18 the children learnt about these patterns and created some themselves. Traditionally Rangoli patterns were made out of sand, rice, grains and chalk. 
