Kia ora,

Waterlea School has good systems in place to track student achievement each year and this has been particularly important since the time of school closures that occurred during COVID. Like all schools, we noticed that our achievement data was much lower after we reopened after a series of Level 3 & 4 school closures and our tamariki came to school full time. Many good shifts have been made in our student achievement data since 2020 and next week we'll show you what these shifts look like. In response to our data, the junior part of the school has adopted a Structured Literacy approach to teaching and learning literacy called Better Start Literacy Approach (BSLA). In the past, the way we taught literacy was more aligned with a Balanced Literacy approach. Last week a group of about 50 parents came to a workshop to learn more about BSLA and the similarities and differences between the two literacy approaches. BSLA is a structured approach to literacy instruction for Year 0 to Year 2 classrooms, to support children's early reading, writing and oral language success. It has been developed by the team at Canterbury University specifically for our New Zealand educational and cultural context and controlled research trials have proven effectiveness.





BSLA teaching includes:

- The systematic teaching of critical phonological awareness skills and letter sound knowledge skills through fun, games-based activities
- Activities making explicit links to the reading and spelling context
- Structured small group reading sessions using the new Ready to Read Phonics Plus early readers series
- Explicit teaching in vocabulary skills and in building children's oral narrative and listening comprehension skills through quality children's story books
- Following a structured phonics scope and sequence that is used in the class and small group reading teaching



Dear parents and caregivers,

We are asking that jibitz are treated like toys and therefore should remain at home.




Bikes and scooters left at school
