#### Kia ora Whaanau

As the days grow shorter and the temperature drops, winter is definitely on its way. This seasonal shift brings with it some important things to keep in mind to ensure our tamariki stay warm, healthy and happy throughout the colder months. Here are a few key areas to be mindful of as we head into winter:

<u>Layers</u>: Just like us, children feel the cold. Encourage them to wear layers of clothing rather than one thick item. This allows them to adjust as their activity levels change throughout the day. Think thermal tops and bottoms, singlets which can be worn under the Waterlea school uniform, and waterproof jackets.

Warm hats that cover ears: These are really helpful for keeping precious body heat in on cold mornings and lunchtimes particularly for tamariki who are more susceptible to cold and flu viruses.

<u>Wearing shoes</u>: Cold and damp feet can make anyone miserable. Ensure your child has waterproof shoes for school and outdoor activities. Dry socks are also really helpful so pack an extra pair in your child's bag if they enjoy outside wet adventures.

<u>Sleep</u>: Ensure children are getting enough sleep, as rest is vital for fighting off winter bugs.

<u>Hand hygiene</u>: Reinforce the importance of regular and thorough handwashing with soap and water, especially after being outside, before eating and after coughing or sneezing. Hand sanitiser is a good backup when soap and water aren't readily available.

<u>Cover coughs and sneezes</u>: Teach children to cough or sneeze into their elbow or a tissue to prevent the spread of germs.

Keep children home if unwell: If your child is showing signs of illness like a fever, cough, sore throat, or runny nose, please keep them home from school to prevent the spread of infection to others.

We're excited to announce that swimming for Years 4-6 will be starting next Wednesday 14 May. Our tamariki will be timetabled throughout the day and will be transported by bus. A letter including a permission slip would've come home and needs to be returned to the classroom teachers in order for your child to participate. This letter will have other swimming information you will need to support your children to be prepared. If you have not received a letter, please check bags and then contact the classroom teacher.

### **Teacher Led Conferences and Mid Year School Reports**

Towards the end of the term we will be holding teacher/parent conferences and sending home mid year school progress reports. Over the next few weeks we will share with you Waterlea's school wide approach to conferences and reports. We will also communicate our progress familiarising ourselves with the changes outlined in the revised 2025 NZ Curriculum, particularly in Maths and Literacy.

To support this initiative, Tamariki are having turns delivering this to the rest of the school via our intercom system just before the end of the day.
