Parking Around Waterlea School

We're writing to you today about a matter of paramount importance: the safety of our children during school drop-off and pick-up times. As you know, these periods are incredibly busy, and while we understand the rush of daily schedules, we've noticed an increasing number of vehicles parking on yellow lines and over driveways particularly around the Muir Ave/Ambury Road intersection.

This practice, though seemingly minor, creates significant safety hazards. When cars are parked in no-stopping zones, on yellow lines, or across driveways, it obstructs the view for both children and drivers, making it difficult to see oncoming traffic or pedestrians. This significantly increases the risk of a accidents, and even a minor incident could have serious consequences for a child. Our primary goal is to ensure every student arrives and departs from school safely each day.

Beyond the immediate safety concerns, this kind of parking also impacts our wider community. It can inconvenience our neighbours by blocking access to their properties and create unnecessary traffic congestion, affecting everyone's daily commute. We believe that fostering a sense of community-mindedness means looking out for one another, and that includes ensuring the safety and convenience of all who share our local roads.

We understand that parking can sometimes be challenging, especially during peak times and wet weather. However, we urge you to please park in a responsible manner, even if it means a slightly longer walk to the school gate. We realise that the construction of the apartments on the corner of House Ave, Muir Ave has increased traffic and the amount of parked vehicles around our school. Once this construction has been completed the reduced parking situation will continue as we will have the occupants and their visitors parking on the road. Thinking about finding some solutions now is timely and important.

By working together and prioritising safety, we can ensure that our school environment remains secure for all students and that we continue to be considerate neighbours. Your cooperation in this matter is deeply appreciated.


Support The PJ Project!
