Student Led Conferences

Student Led Conferences

On **Thursday 11 September**, we will be holding our Student Led Conferences (SLC). Please note that school finishes early and **all children are to go home at 1.00pm on that day**. For those families that require childcare from 1.00pm that day, our before and after school care provider (sKids) is available. Please contact them directly on 027 240 0024 or admin@skids.co.nz.

SLC are an opportunity for students to lead a conversation about their learning at Waterlea. Each SLC lasts for 25 minutes and the teacher will also be available to answer questions during this time. The SLC start at 2.00pm and finish at 7.10pm and there will be 3-4 conferences happening at the same time within each classroom.

If English is not the language used in your home we invite you to conduct your child's conference in the language with which you feel most comfortable.

As this is a time to focus on your child and their learning, we ask that if you are bringing other siblings along, that you make use of the child minding service in the library space between Rooms 6 and 7. If you intend to do this, please complete the google form by clicking on this link: Child minding. If your child is in Room 21 the SLC will run differently because your children have only just started school. More information regarding booking will come home at the end of the week.





Winter has well and truly hit our tamariki hard this year with lots of colds, coughs, flu and covid still around.

If your child is experiencing these symptoms it is always best to have them checked out at the doctor.

If your child is diagnosed with an illness, eg whooping cough, we would appreciate it if you could let the office know so we can alert others.

To keep all our tamariki safe we ask you to send all cold and flu medication to the office. This is so we can monitor use at school and includes medication needed just for the day.

Examples - nasal sprays, cough drops, inhalers, pain relief, antibiotics etc

When these items are kept in a school lunch box, they could accidentally be taken by children who could be allergic.




