The theme for this year is - "Ātuitui'ia au ki te Oneone o tōku 'Ui Tupuna," which translates to "Connect me to the soils of my ancestors." This powerful theme encourages us to strengthen our connection to our heritage, our roots, and the rich traditions passed down through generations.

The Cook Islands Māori language, Te Reo Māori Kūki 'Āirani, is a vital part of the identity of the Cook Islands community. It is a beautiful language, rich with history, stories, and a deep connection to the natural world. Language is the heart of a culture, and by celebrating and using Te Reo Māori Kūki 'Āirani, we help to ensure its survival and growth for future generations.

Only donate books that you are ready to release into the wild! No special treasures please!


Just bring 1 or 2 books.


Only children's books that are age appropriate please.


